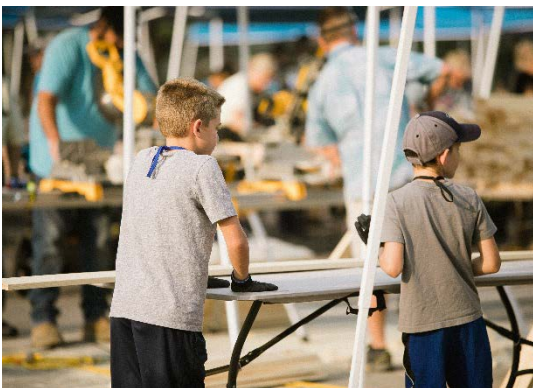

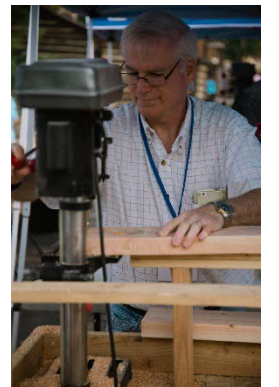

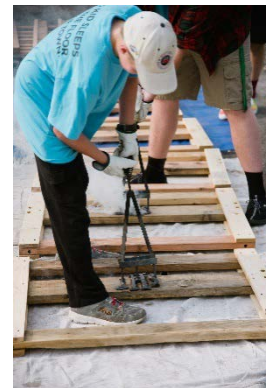

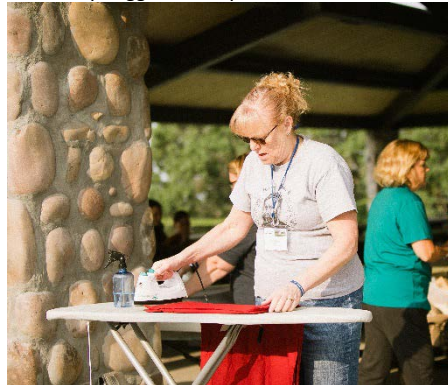

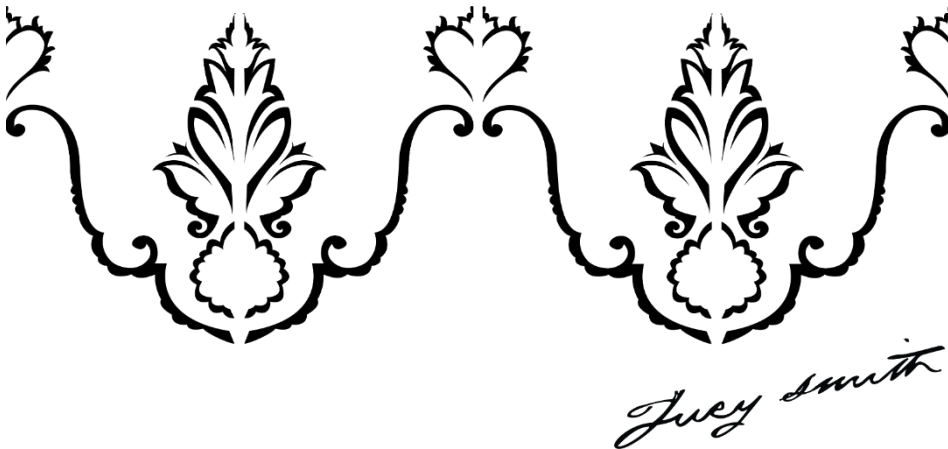

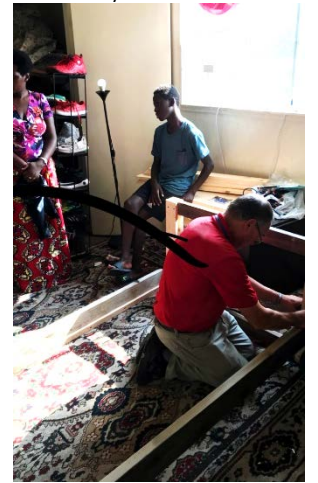
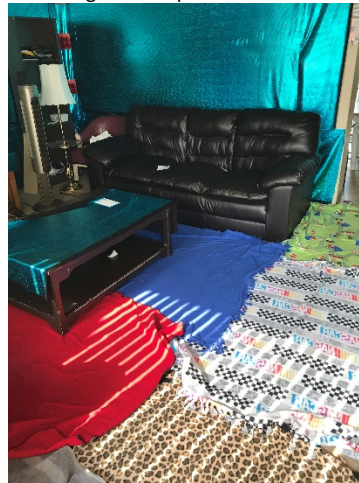


This pattern was taken from one of Lucy Mack Smith's shawls. The stencil design was made by Smith Family member, Danielle Maddox. The project was under the direction of Debbie Nelson and Julie Maddox. The idea was to help the Smith's relate to what their ancestors did. Lucy Mack Smith and her daughters would paint oil cloth and sell it to help their family. The space we were using was new and the concern with paints was marring the new surfaces. Debbie Nelson came up with the idea to use the design's with vinyl. Later, we had one hundred pillowcases donated by a family member.

The Smith Family built one hundred bunk beds and twenty bunk beds which equals forty beds were assembled for refugees in the Salt Lake City area
