In the evening the group took an hour ride to the east to "the Old Tavern", an Inn that dates back to 1798. Without doubt our progenitors stayed at this way station while traveling from the east to Kirtland. With great food and clean entertainment, it was an enjoyable evening.





The Old Tavern today retains much of the romance and atmosphere of the old days. The dusty, rutted roads of the earlier century are gone. Today vast, smooth highways connect our cities and shrink distances.

Plan on visiting the historic Old Tavern at Unionville. Here you'll find a friendly atmosphere and excellent food.



THE OLD TAVERN

> Unionville, Ohio Route 84 at County Line Road





The original Old Tavern was one of the first log cabins built in the Western Reserve in 1798. Measuring 12x15 feet, the building was first known as the Webster House, then the New England House and finally as the Old Tavern.

Because of its location, the cabin became a popular stopping place for covered wagons coming from Pittsburgh, then known as the gateway to the West. As its popularity grew, a second cabin was built beside it with a roofed entry connecting the two identical cabins.

The huge fireplace was constructed of field stones and iron kettles hung from hardwood cranes. Ovens on each side kept meals hot for hungry travelers. The early furniture was homemade; tables and chairs were of split wood slabs. The original bark-covered logs may be seen today in the basement of the Old Tavern. By 1803 the Old Tavern was on the first mail route originating at Warren and terminating at Cleveland. In 1818 William Whitman of Ashtabula and Calvin Cole of Painesville purchased the Old Tavern and enlarged it to a two-storied salt-box house with rooms arranged as they are today. Later they built a quaint ballroom where pioneers danced their quadrilles, reels and hornpipes. This room, too, is intact today as it was then. Business became so brisk that a number of poster beds were set up and people had to double up; rarely could a traveler room alone.

Ownership of the Old Tavern changed in 1820 and the new proprietors added four classical wooden pillars to the front — these may also be seen today. After the Civil War many parties were held in the ballroom and in winter sleighing parties stopped at the Old Tavern for dancing and an oyster supper costing fifty cents.

During the Abolition Movement the Old Tavern became a station on the underground railway. Runaway slaves were quartered in secret closets and basement tunnels, some of which may be viewed today. Some slaves stayed on to become servants and field hands at the Tavern.






