NAUVOO, Ill. — A new scene featuring a depiction of the Nauvoo Temple highlighted this year's presentation of the annual "City of Joseph" pageant, which played to crowds totaling more than 50,000 during its run July 30-31 and Aug. 3-7.

The pageant commenced in spite of sweltering heat. In the week prior to opening night, cast members rehearsed outdoors all day as temperatures soared to 105 degrees with a heat index of 120.

With new music and special effects, the historical musical production tells the story of the sunrise and sunset of Old Nauvoo on the east bank of the Mississippi River. In the 1840s, it rivaled Chicago in size and was a bustling, growing metropolis. Several years ago, President Hinckley referred to it as "the miracle city of Illinois."

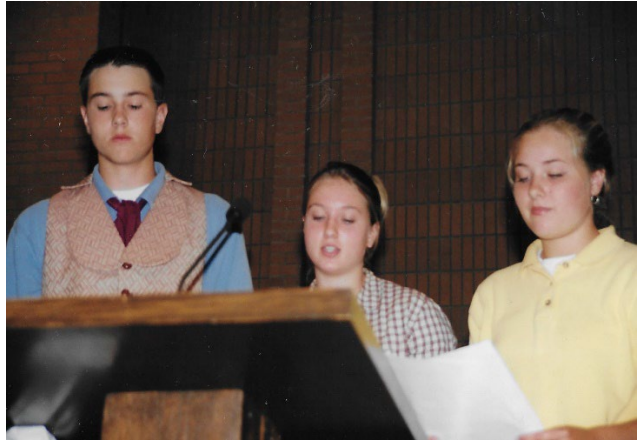

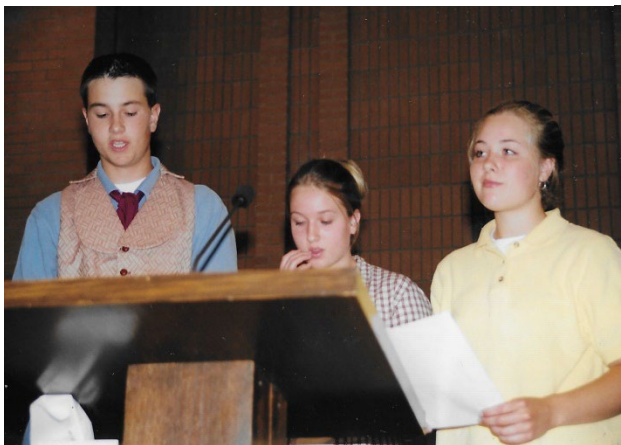

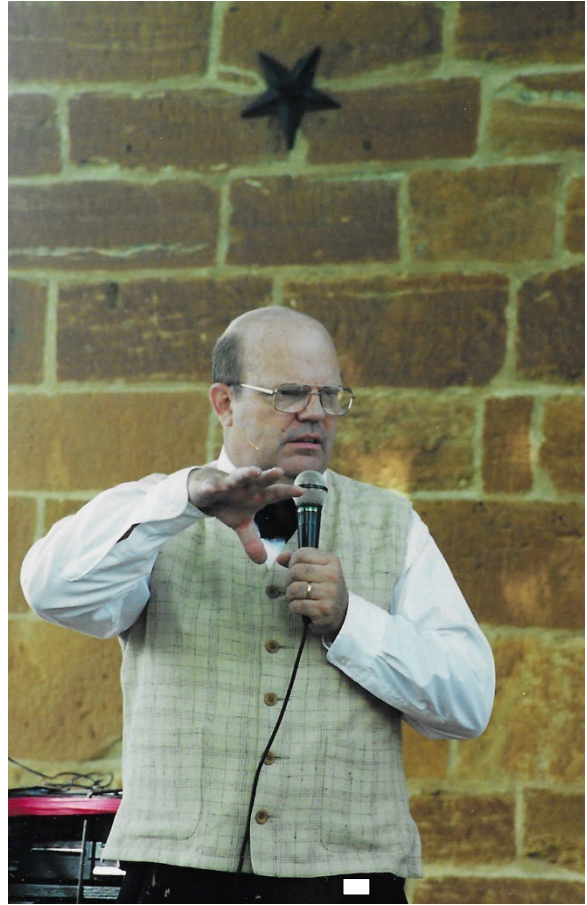

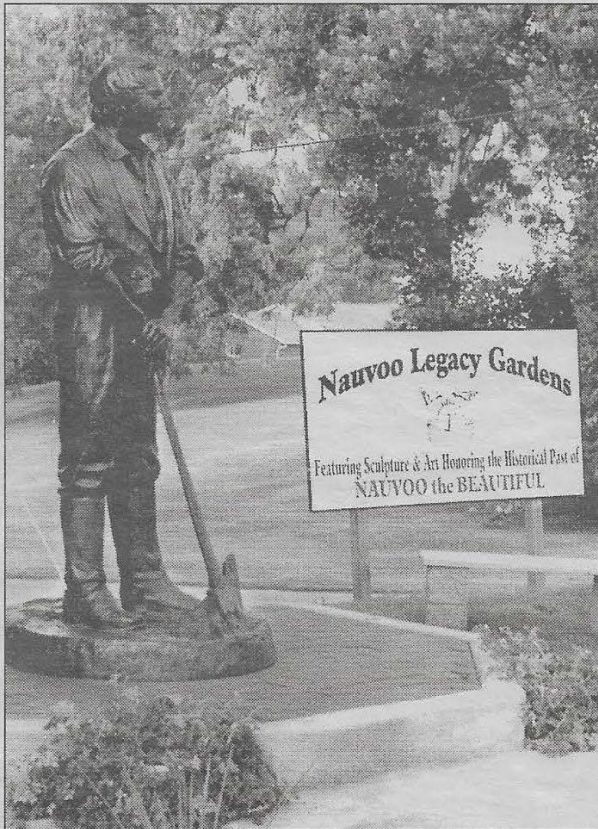

Gardens dedicated in honor of Joseph Sr. and Lucy Mack Smith

NAUVOO, ILL.

With the desire to contribute to the beautification of Nauvoo, Ill., a group of members and Smith family descendants recently dedicated the new Nauvoo Legacy Gardens, a tribute to the Joseph Sr. and Lucy Mack Smith family.

"It has been created as a place of beauty and culture to display special memorials to events and personalities that played a significant role in the history of Nauvoo," said Sister Hortense Smith, wife of Patriarch Emeritus Eldred G. Smith. "Donations are from people who love and revere the Prophet Joseph and the Smith Family and who want to visibly perpetuate a tribute and memorial to them."

Brother Smith, 92, who also attended, is the oldest living descendant of Joseph Sr. and Lucy Mack Smith. Other descendants, including members of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, also took part.

The gardens currently host two monuments. At the entrance is a bronze statue of the "Pioneer Prophet" Joseph Smith, sculpted by Dee Jay Bawden. Another is a three-ton Vermont granite stone with a memorial plaque featuring the faces of Joseph Sr. and Lucy Mack Smith. — **Genelle Pugmire**
