

Lucy Mack Smith Commemoration

Lucy Mack Smith Sign:

Lucy Mack Smith was born near this spot on July 8, 1775 to Solomon and Lydia Gates Mack. In 1796 she married Joseph Smith, Sr., and became the mother of eleven children. She was taught by a saintly mother to love God and revere scripture. Lucy taught her own children to love scripture and to seek God in prayer. Lucy's fourth son, Joseph Smith, Ir., restored in 1830 what would become The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Lucy sustained her prophet son, and provided leadership and succor to the growing body of converts. She counseled the women of the Church, "We must cherish one another, watch over one another, comfort one another, and gain instruction that we may all sit down in heaven together."


