#### Remembering Solomon Mack

"I have a love to all rich and poor, kings and nobles, black and white, come all to Jesus my friends, come to Jesus, and he will in no wise cast you off."

Although he came from a long line of preachers, Solomon Mack, father of Lucy Mack Smith, ridiculed religion. At age 4, he and his siblings were indentured as servants to other families, where he was not taught to read or write and knew nothing of God. Freed

at age 21, Solomon set out on his own. He sought and obtained property, but "by misfortunes, time after time I lost it." He faced numerous life-threatening accidents and illness.

Undeterred, he pushed forward, privateering, starting businesses, selling supplies, sailing vessels, and fighting in the French and Indian War and the Revolution. When his wrists were broken, he earned a dollar per day by traveling from town to town, teaching them to make saltpeter (gunpowder).

He married Lydia Gates, who taught their children to read, write, ...Love p.3

### **Kindred Cousins**

In the past year, the Smith family lost Wallace B. Smith (1929-2023), Prophet Emeritus of Community of Christ and M. Russell Ballard (1928-2023), President of the Council of the Twelve of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. In 1990, these two, with a small handful of cousins, were involved in establishing the Joseph and Hyrum Smith Family Foundation, which later became the Joseph Smith Sr. and Lucy Mack Smith Family Foundation. They worked to renovate the Smith Family Cemetery in Nauvoo, IL, and then to fund an endowment for its perpetual care.

President Smith said that the cemetery renovation created "an increased feeling of unity and fellowship between the branches of the family....I think

this certainly brought about a greater degree of love."\* In 1991, the Smith Family dedicated the cemetery, with President Wallace B. Smith giving the dedicatory prayer. Elder Ballard said he felt "a kindred cousinship that has developed between the two of us that is very precious and important."

Wallace B. Smith is the great-grandson of Joseph and Emma Smith. A doctor by profession, Wallace B. Smith entered



leadership in the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ, now Community of Christ, from 1975-1996. During his 18-year tenure, significant changes included changing the church's name, "a temple dedicated to peace, welcoming women into the priesthood, opening communion to all Christians, and expanding eligibility for the role of [church] president beyond the Smith family."

He cared for God, family, and church, and sought to alleviate hunger and world poverty.

He became a member of the First Quorum of the Seventy in 1976 and a member of the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles in 1985. He made "epic efforts to overcome divisions and honor pioneers of all faiths," a fellow quorum member stated. President Ballard invited all to "give service to and build faith in Jesus Christ."

and walk uprightly before God. At age 76, suffering from rheumatism, these words came to him, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." He pondered these words repeatedly.

"One evening by the fire," Solomon records, "I prayed to the Lord, if he was with me that I might

know it by this token-that my pains might all be eased for that night; and blessed be the Lord, I was entirely free from pain that night, and I rejoiced in the God of my salvation, found Christ's promises verified."

His personal narrative closes with the quote on page 1.
