



Sharing their knowledge with the Smith Family Reunion in Nauvoo - 2022

Gary & Elizabeth Smith E. Gary Smith, third great-grandson of Hyrum Smith, brother of the Prophet, and his wife, Elizabeth Shaw Smith, will tell "behind the scenes" stories of Hyrum and Joseph in the fascinating early days of the Restoration and the martyrdom, using priceless family heirlooms and relics which have been handed down in Gary's family. Included in these items were the box in which Joseph kept the Gold Plates for a time, the clothes and watch Hyrum was wearing when he was murdered, with bullet holes and Hyrum's blood stains still visible, Hyrum's Nauvoo Legion dress sword, and other relics.

Elizabeth is a graduate of BYU (B.A. and M.A. in English) and the University of Utah College of Law. She is a former Associate Editor of the ENSIGN magazine and scholarly books editor at BYU Press.

American Prophet - The Urban Musical, tells the story 5 Black men -- a fiery preacher a barber, and 3 former slaves -- who all convert because of Joseph Smiths powerful witness of the restoration and first vision.
