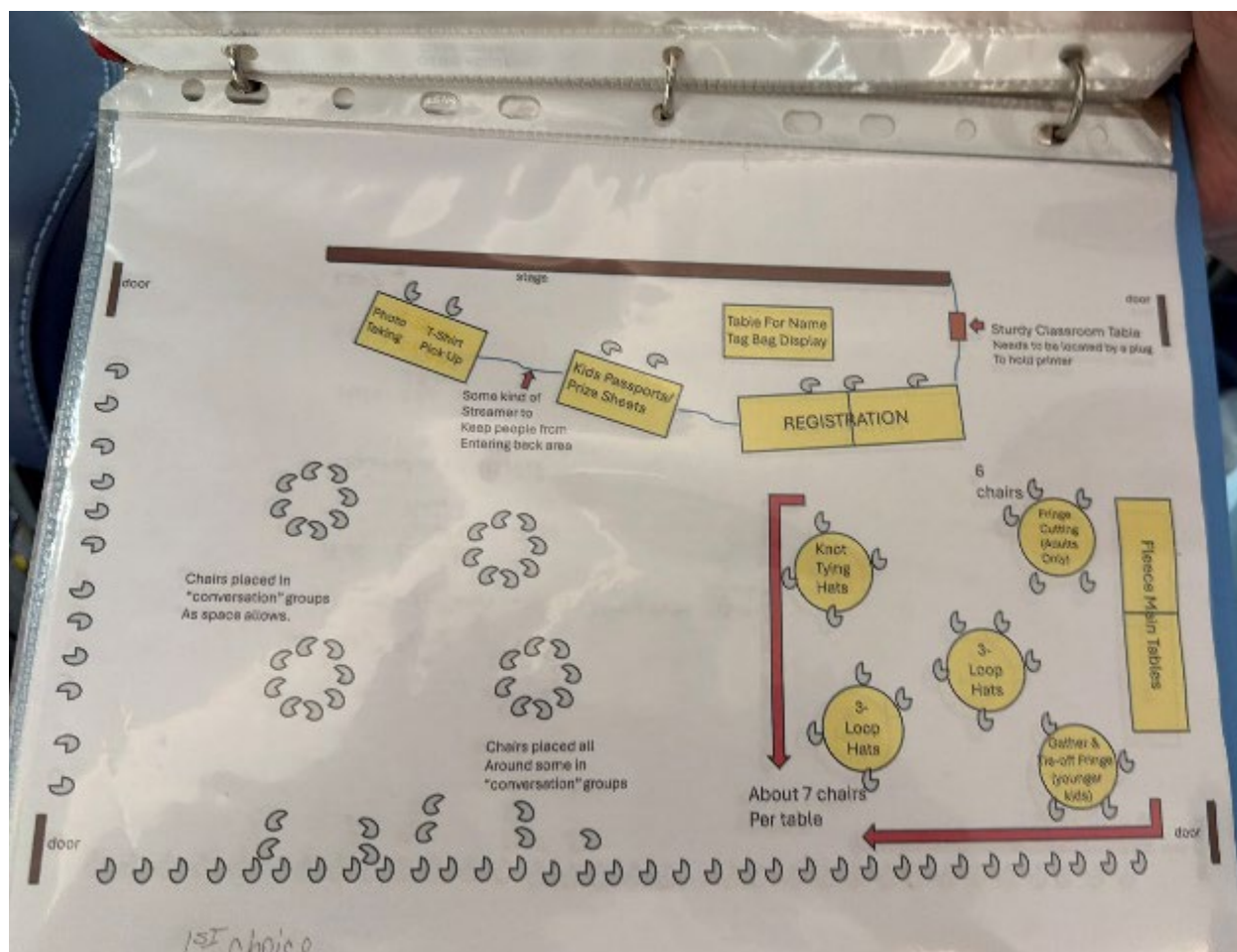

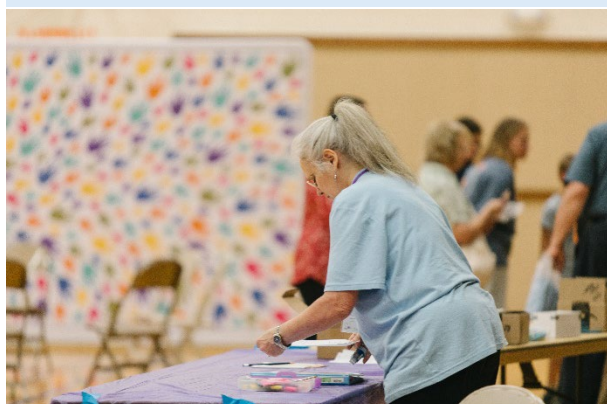

Elder Ballard said that Kirtland was sacred holy ground. He also said, "We may yet find out that Kirtland is our most significant church history site."

President Ezra Taft Benson made this statement. He said, "There is no other church history site that we have that is more important than Kirtland."

I'd like to read to you what President Hickley said in his dedicatory prayer. He said this, "There is no other area of the church where so much revelation was received. There is no other place where thy beloved son was so revealed to mortal man. In no other place was there such remarkable manifestations given to so many."

President Russell M. Nelson made the statement that "The Lord appeared often out of love" in Kirtland. He also said that "several events took place there that had been prophesied for millennia and were essential for the Lord's restored Church to fulfill its latter-day mission."

One of the statements about Kirtland is that ancient prophets, ancient kings, ancient priests had seen our day and had prophesied without being able to see our day. Essential keys were restored by ancient prophets in Kirtland.

In addition to that, we have many manifestations that occurred in Kirtland. There were three purposes really in my view that were fulfilled in Kirtland.

One was it was our organizational period. Every step, every office that we have in the church today was put in place in Kirtland. It was our organizational period. Our first bishop, our first state president, our first high council, our first patriarch, our first multiple quorums of the 70, the quorum of the 12, the first presidency, all of these offices were put in place during the Kirtland years.

The second important thing that I think we categorize many things is it was our teaching period, in a sense the Galilee of our dispensation. When we look at the school of the prophets that was taking place, you're going to be in that little room in the Whitney store where the school of the prophets, our first formal school was put in place. Every one of our scriptures, basic scriptures in the church were impacted in Kirtland. The Bible - we have Joseph Smith and the translation or inspired version of the Bible. We also have the Pearl of Great Price, part of the book of Moses. The Book of Abraham was given to the church during those Kirtland years. And before the temple was dedicated, we have Joseph teaching principles out of that book. The Book of Mormon, our second edition was printed in Kirtland. The Pearl of Great Price. Each one of our scriptures was impacted during the Kirtland years.

The third purpose, as I view it, that was completed was that it was our Pentecostal period.

That term Pentecost or Pentecostal period" is not generally understood. But I think that for all of us was that it was a period of greatest spiritual manifestations similar to the day of Pentecost as described in the New Testament Book of Acts. For example, at least 15 past ancient prophets appeared to Joseph Smith in Kirtland.

When we talk of the restoration, we have for example seven times that God, The Father and Jesus Christ together appeared to Joseph Smith in the Johnson Home, the Morley farm, the Whitney store, and in the Kirtland Temple. In addition to that we have the savior appearing four times. For a total of 11 times the Savior was seen.

The early Saints knew him. He spoke to him. He bore 13 testimonies of who He was through scripture given in Kirtland. Past prophets come back and appear again in fulfillment of ancient prophecy. Moses, Elias, and Elijah came to Joseph and Oliver. In addition to that, Peter, James, and John were seen in the Kirtland Temple.

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Marvelous spiritual manifestations were repeated frequently once the temple was built. In one meeting, Joseph Smith reported there were a hundred men there and said that multitudes of angels were present in the room. In one account, Joseph said they communicated and spoke with the angels that were there in that room.

One early leader, Erastus Snow, said there were 12 legions of angels seen in one meeting. You're going to be in these rooms where those things occurred. The Spirit is still there to be felt in addition to learning about the Savior.

Missionaries were there serving when President Hinckley dedicated Historic Kirtland in 2003. They reported that the next morning there was as if a showering of peace came over those sites. It settled in and they felt a spiritual presence from heaven. It will be a place where you will feel the spirit. It will be a place where, as Joseph Smith described, the Heavenly Priesthood came together with the Earthly Priesthood to bring about the restoration of all things. You won't see that happening as much in other sites as in Kirtland. That's where it was centered. It is the land of the Savior, which is another name I give it. The Savior was present. You'll feel his spirit. And we hope that all of you will enjoy your time now in Kirtland.

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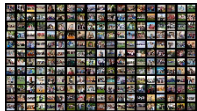
Joseph Smith Sr. Family Reunion Service Projects History (2007-2026)

2014	Independence, Missouri was chosen for the reunion this summer to celebrate important anniversaries in our family history; the dedication of the temple lot as well as one of the original Smith reunions held in Independence more than forty years ago. Our theme "Walking in their Shoes" helped us remember our Smith ancestors who lived in Missouri, their efforts to build Zion, and courage as they faced great trials. 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2018	We worked through Sleep In Heavenly Peace to help refugee families have a place to sleep. The Smith Family had been driven from their home two hundred years before and had to relocate and rebuild in a new place. More than anyone, the Smiths knew what it meant to be homeless and refugees. 2026	For our service project we tied 230 hats and 60 scarves for the homeless. In addition, the family donated \$2,000 to The City Mission of Cleveland which is a place where children, women, and men receive Christ-centered care, tangible support, and the opportunity to begin again—restoring lives and leading toward lasting transformation.
